Lisa Waananen Jones is the Lester M. Smith Distinguished Professor of Journalism and Media Production at The Edward R. Murrow College of Communication at Washington State University, where she specializes in data reporting and visualization, visual communication, and solutions journalism. She was part of the New York Times team awarded the 2021 Pulitzer Prize for Public Service for coverage of the COVID-19 pandemic. With a professional background as local reporter in Spokane and as a graphics reporter at the New York Times, she now teaches visual communication, web video, photojournalism and data visualization. Professor Waananen Jones's innovative teaching has been recognized by the Association for Education in Journalism and Mass Communication, the Online News Association, and the Solutions Journalism Network, among others.

Benjamin Shors is chair of the Department of Journalism and Media Production and a professor at the Edward R. Murrow College of Communication at Washington State University. His scholarship focuses on rural, underrepresented populations in the news media. His writing has appeared in numerous media outlets including The Spokesman-Review, The Seattle Times, The Miami Herald, NBCNews.com, Badische Zeitung, and PBS Media Shift. He has held international fellowships with the International Center for Journalists and the Scripps Howard Journalism Entrepreneurship Institute, and his work has been recognized by the Livingston Foundation, the Child Welfare League of America, the Associated Press, and the Society of Professional Journalists. As a faculty member, he has created several courses including Sports and the Media, and the Murrow News Service capstone course for multimedia journalism students. With his guidance and industry knowledge, Murrow students have published more than 1,000 stories with professional media organizations, earning more than 50 regional and national reporting awards and appearing in local, regional, national, and international news outlets. Through the Murrow News Service, his students have published multimedia content, videos, documentary films, photographs, and essays with outlets such as NBCNews.com, MSNBC.com, ESPNW.com, PBS NewsHour digital, The Seattle Times, The Spokesman-Review, Today.com, The Oregonian (Portland), Northwest Public Broadcasting, and many others.
